
#### Abstract

General Description The MAX13080E-MAX13089E +5.0 V , $\pm 15 \mathrm{kV}$ ESD-protected, RS-485/RS-422 transceivers feature one driver and one receiver. These devices include fail-safe circuitry, guaranteeing a logic-high receiver output when receiver inputs are open or shorted. The receiver outputs a logichigh if all transmitters on a terminated bus are disabled (high impedance). The MAX13080E family include a hotswap capability to eliminate false transitions on the bus during power-up or hot insertion. The MAX13080E/MAX13081E/MAX13082E feature reduced slew-rate drivers that minimize EMI and reduce reflections caused by improperly terminated cables, allowing error-free data transmission up to 250kbps. The MAX13083E/MAX13084E also feature slew-rate-limited drivers but allow transmit speeds up to 500kbps. The MAX13086E/MAX13087E/ MAX13088E driver slew rates are not limited, making transmit speeds up to 16 Mbps possible. The MAX13089E slew rate is pin selectable for $250 \mathrm{kbps}, 500 \mathrm{kbps}$, and 16Mbps. The MAX13082E/MAX13088E are intended for halfduplex communications, and the MAX13080E/ MAX13081E/MAX13083E/MAX13084E/MAX13086E/ MAX13087E are intended for full-duplex communications. The MAX13089E is selectable for half-duplex or full-duplex operation. It also features independently programmable receiver and transmitter output phase through separate pins. The MAX13080E family transceivers draw 1.2 mA of supply current when unloaded or when fully loaded with the drivers disabled. All devices have a $1 / 8$-unit load receiver input impedance, allowing up to 256 transceivers on the bus. The MAX13080E/MAX13083E/MAX13086E/MAX13089E are available in 14-pin PDIP and 14-pin SO packages. The MAX13081E/MAX13082E/MAX13084E/MAX13087E/ MAX13088E are available in 8-pin PDIP and 8-pin SO packages. The devices operate over the commercial, extended, and automotive temperature ranges.

## Detailed Description

The MAX13080E-MAX13089E high-speed transceivers for RS-485/RS-422 communication contain one driver and one receiver. These devices feature fail-safe circuitry, which guarantees a logic-high receiver output when the receiver inputs are open or shorted, or when they are connected to a terminated transmission line with all drivers disabled (see the Fail-Safe section). The MAX13080E/MAX13082E/MAX13083E/MAX13086E/ MAX13088E/MAX13089E also feature a hot-swap capability allowing line insertion without erroneous data transfer (see the Hot Swap Capability section). The MAX13080E/MAX13081E/MAX13082E feature reduced slew-rate drivers that minimize EMI and reduce reflections caused by improperly terminated cables, allowing error-free data transmission up to 250 kbps . The MAX13083E/MAX13084E also offer slew-rate limits allowing transmit speeds up to 500 kbps . The MAX13086E/MAX13087E/MAX13088Es' driver slew rates are not limited, making transmit speeds up to 16 Mbps possible. The MAX13089E's slew rate is selectable between 250 kbps , 500 kbps , and 16 Mbps by driving a selector pin with a three-state driver.
The MAX13082E/MAX13088E are half-duplex transceivers, while the MAX13080E/MAX13081E/ MAX13083E/ MAX13084E/MAX13086E/MAX13087E are full-duplex transceivers. The MAX13089E is selectable between half- and full-duplex communication by driving a selector pin $(H / \bar{F})$ high or low, respectively.
All devices operate from a single +5.0 V supply. Drivers are output short-circuit current limited. Thermal-shutdown circuitry protects drivers against excessive power dissipation. When activated, the thermal-shutdown circuitry places the driver outputs into a high-impedance state.

## Receiver Input Filtering

The receivers of the MAX13080E-MAX13084E, and the MAX13089E when operating in 250 kbps or 500 kbps mode, incorporate input filtering in addition to input hysteresis. This filtering enhances noise immunity with differential signals that have very slow rise and fall times. Receiver propagation delay increases by $25 \%$ due to this filtering.

Fail-Safe
The MAX13080E family guarantees a logic-high receiver output when the receiver inputs are shorted or open, or when they are connected to a terminated transmission line with all drivers disabled. This is done by setting the receiver input threshold between -50 mV and -200 mV . If the differential receiver input voltage ( $\mathrm{A}-\mathrm{B}$ ) is greater than or equal to $-50 \mathrm{mV}, R O$ is logic-high. If $(A-B)$ is less
than or equal to $-200 \mathrm{mV}, \mathrm{RO}$ is logic-low. In the case of a terminated bus with all transmitters disabled, the receiver's differential input voltage is pulled to OV by the termination. With the receiver thresholds of the MAX13080E family, this results in a logic-high with a 50 mV minimum noise margin. Unlike previous fail-safe devices, the -50 mV to -200 mV threshold complies with the $\pm 200 \mathrm{mV}$ EIA/TIA-485 standard.

## Hot-Swap Capability (Except MAX13081E/MAX13084E/MAX13087E)

## Hot-Swap Inputs

When circuit boards are inserted into a hot or powered backplane, differential disturbances to the data bus can lead to data errors. Upon initial circuit board insertion, the data communication processor undergoes its own power-up sequence. During this period, the processor's logic-output drivers are high impedance and are unable to drive the DE and $\overline{R E}$ inputs of these devices to a defined logic level. Leakage currents up to $\pm 10 \mu \mathrm{~A}$ from the high-impedance state of the processor's logic drivers could cause standard CMOS enable inputs of a transceiver to drift to an incorrect logic level. Additionally, parasitic circuit board capacitance could cause coupling of VCC or GND to the enable inputs. Without the hot-swap capability, these factors could improperly enable the transceiver's driver or receiver.
When $\mathrm{V}_{\mathrm{CC}}$ rises, an internal pulldown circuit holds DE low and $\overline{R E}$ high. After the initial power-up sequence, the pulldown circuit becomes transparent, resetting the hot-swap tolerable input.

Hot-Swap Input Circuitry The enable inputs feature hot-swap capability. At the input there are two NMOS devices, M1 and M2 (Figure 9). When VCC ramps from zero, an internal $7 \mu \mathrm{~s}$ timer turns on M2 and sets the SR latch, which also turns on M1. Transistors M2, a 500 AA current sink, and M1, a $100 \mu \mathrm{~A}$ current sink, pull DE to GND through a $5 \mathrm{k} \Omega$ resistor. M 2 is designed to pull $D E$ to the disabled state against an external parasitic capacitance up to 100pF that can drive DE high. After $7 \mu \mathrm{~s}$, the timer deactivates M 2 while M 1 remains on, holding DE low against three-state leakages that can drive DE high. M1 remains on until an external source overcomes the required input current. At this time, the SR latch resets and M1 turns off. When M1 turns off, DE reverts to a standard, high-impedance CMOS input. Whenever VCC drops below 1 V , the hot-swap input is reset.
For $\overline{\mathrm{RE}}$ there is a complementary circuit employing two PMOS devices pulling $\overline{R E}$ to VCC.

MAX13089E Programming
The MAX13089E has several programmable operating modes. Transmitter rise and fall times are programmable, resulting in maximum data rates of 250 kbps , 500 kbps , and 16 Mbps . To select the desired data rate, drive SRL to one of three possible states by using a three-state driver: VCC, GND, or unconnected. For 250kbps operation, set the three-state device in highimpedance mode or leave SRL unconnected. For 500 kbps operation, drive SRL high or connect it to VCC. For 16 Mbps operation, drive SRL low or connect it to GND. SRL can be changed during operation without interrupting data communications.
Occasionally, twisted-pair lines are connected backward from normal orientation. The MAX13089E has two pins that invert the phase of the driver and the receiver to correct this problem. For normal operation, drive TXP and RXP low, connect them to ground, or leave them unconnected (internal pulldown). To invert the driver phase, drive TXP high or connect it to $\mathrm{V}_{\mathrm{C}}$. To invert the receiver phase, drive RXP high or connect it to Vcc. Note that the receiver threshold is positive when RXP is high.
The MAX13089E can operate in full- or half-duplex mode. Drive H/F low, leave it unconnected (internal pulldown), or connect it to GND for full-duplex opera-
tion. Drive $H / \bar{F}$ high for half-duplex operation. In fullduplex mode, the pin configuration of the driver and receiver is the same as that of a MAX13080E. In halfduplex mode, the receiver inputs are internally connected to the driver outputs through a resistor-divider. This effectively changes the function of the device's outputs. Y becomes the noninverting driver output and receiver input, Z becomes the inverting driver output and receiver input. In half-duplex mode, A and B are still connected to ground through an internal resistor-divider but they are not internally connected to the receiver.

## 土15kV ESD Protection

As with all Maxim devices, ESD-protection structures are incorporated on all pins to protect against electrostatic discharges encountered during handling and assembly. The driver outputs and receiver inputs of the MAX13080E family of devices have extra protection against static electricity. Maxim's engineers have developed state-of-the-art structures to protect these pins against ESD of $\pm 15 \mathrm{kV}$ without damage. The ESD structures withstand high ESD in all states: normal operation, shutdown, and powered down. After an ESD event, the MAX13080E family keep working without latchup or damage.
ESD protection can be tested in various ways. The transmitter outputs and receiver inputs of the MAX13080E family are characterized for protection to the following limits:

- $\pm 15 \mathrm{kV}$ using the Human Body Model
- $\pm 6 \mathrm{kV}$ using the Contact Discharge method specified in IEC 61000-4-2


## ESD Test Conditions

ESD performance depends on a variety of conditions. Contact Maxim for a reliability report that documents test setup, test methodology, and test results.

## Human Body Model

Figure 10a shows the Human Body Model, and Figure 10b shows the current waveform it generates when discharged into a low impedance. This model consists of a 100 pF capacitor charged to the ESD voltage of interest, which is then discharged into the test device through a $1.5 \mathrm{k} \Omega$ resistor.

IEC 61000-4-2
The IEC 61000-4-2 standard covers ESD testing and performance of finished equipment. However, it does not specifically refer to integrated circuits. The MAX13080E family of devices helps you design equipment to meet IEC 61000-4-2, without the need for additional ESD-protection components.

The major difference between tests done using the Human Body Model and IEC 61000-4-2 is higher peak current in IEC 61000-4-2 because series resistance is lower in the IEC 61000-4-2 model. Hence, the ESD withstand voltage measured to IEC 61000-4-2 is generally lower than that measured using the Human Body Model. Figure 10c shows the IEC 61000-4-2 model, and Figure 10d shows the current waveform for IEC 61000-4-2 ESD Contact Discharge test.

## Machine Model

The machine model for ESD tests all pins using a 200pF storage capacitor and zero discharge resistance. The objective is to emulate the stress caused when I/O pins are contacted by handling equipment during test and assembly. Of course, all pins require this protection, not just RS-485 inputs and outputs.

## 256 Transceivers on the Bus

The standard RS-485 receiver input impedance is $12 \mathrm{k} \Omega$ (1-unit load), and the standard driver can drive up to 32unit loads. The MAX13080E family of transceivers has a $1 / 8$-unit load receiver input impedance ( $96 \mathrm{k} \Omega$ ), allowing up to 256 transceivers to be connected in parallel on one communication line. Any combination of these devices, as well as other RS-485 transceivers with a total of 32unit loads or fewer, can be connected to the line.

## Reduced EMI and Reflections

The MAX13080E/MAX13081E/MAX13082E feature reduced slew-rate drivers that minimize EMI and reduce reflections caused by improperly terminated cables, allowing error-free data transmission up to 250kbps. The MAX13083E/MAX13084E offer higher driver output slew-rate limits, allowing transmit speeds up to 500 kbps . The MAX13089E with SRL $=$ VCc or unconnected are slew-rate limited. With SRL unconnected, the MAX13089E error-free data transmission is up to 250kbps. With SRL connected to VCc, the data transmit speeds up to 500kbps.

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## Low-Power Shutdown Mode (Except <br> MAX13081E/MAX13084E/MAX13087E)

Low-power shutdown mode is initiated by bringing both $\overline{R E}$ high and DE low. In shutdown, the devices typically draw only $2.8 \mu \mathrm{~A}$ of supply current.
$\overline{R E}$ and DE can be driven simultaneously; the devices are guaranteed not to enter shutdown if $\overline{R E}$ is high and $D E$ is low for less than 50 ns . If the inputs are in this state for at least 700ns, the devices are guaranteed to enter shutdown.
Enable times tZH and tzL (see the Switching Characteristics section) assume the devices were not in a low-power shutdown state. Enable times tZH(SHDN) and tZL(SHDN) assume the devices were in shutdown state. It takes drivers and receivers longer to become enabled from low-power shutdown mode (tZH(SHDN), tZL(SHDN)) than from driver/receiver-disable mode (tZH, tZL).

## Driver Output Protection

Two mechanisms prevent excessive output current and power dissipation caused by faults or by bus contention. The first, a foldback current limit on the output stage, provides immediate protection against short circuits over the whole common-mode voltage range (see the Typical Operating Characteristics). The second, a thermal-shutdown circuit, forces the driver outputs into a high-impedance state if the die temperature exceeds $+175^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ (typ).

## Line Length

The RS-485/RS-422 standard covers line lengths up to 4000 ft . For line lengths greater than 4000ft, use the repeater application shown in Figure 11.

## Typical Applications

The MAX13082E/MAX13088E/MAX13089E transceivers are designed for bidirectional data communications on multipoint bus transmission lines. Figures 12 and 13 show typical network applications circuits.
To minimize reflections, terminate the line at both ends in its characteristic impedance, and keep stub lengths off the main line as short as possible. The slew-rate-limited MAX13082E and the two modes of the MAX13089E are more tolerant of imperfect termination.
